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32nd Convocation at Regional Centre Vatakara

IGNOU Regional Centre Vatakara celebrated its 32nd Convocation in a glittering function on 3rd April 2019. The function was graced with the presence of the Hon'ble Vice President of India, Shri.M. Venkaiah Naidu who was the Chief Guest at the National Ceremony organized at IGNOU, Maidan Garhi, New Delhi. The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of IGNOU, Prof. Nageshwar Rao while welcoming the Hon.ble Vice President of India laid stress on the significant role that IGNOU plays in democratizing higher education. The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor also highlighted significant initiatives taken up by the university, such as the CBCS, Skill Development initiatives, Unnat Bharat and Swatchh Bharat Abiyan. The Guest of Honour at the Regional Centre was Prof.Gopinath Ravindran, Vice-Chancellor, Kannur University, Kerala. The glittering ceremony saw the awarding of Gold Medal to Ms. Soorya. M who secured 1st rank for MTTM Programme in the whole country. While delivering the Convocation address at the HQs, the Hon'ble Vice President of India stressed upon the yeomen role played by Institutions like IGNOU in spreading education in the country. In his address, Prof.Gopinath Ravindran emphasised upon the need for expanding the horizons of Education in India and more particularly in Kerala, while spelling out the immense role that IGNOU Regional Centre Vatakara has to play in this regard. As many as 200,000 numbers of learners were awarded Degrees and Diplomas at the 32^{nd} Convocation and at them 1115 were from IGNOU RC Vatakara.

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Digital Orientation Programme for Mentally Challenged children at Asha Niketan

Mentally challenged children are perhaps the most neglected group in the society. The challenge of bringing up a child with differential mental capabilities is enormous and pain staking. The social protection cover to such children is almost absent and very less importance is given to the educational upbringing and skill enhancement of such groups. IGNOU Regional Centre Vatakara has always considered as its bounden duty to enhance the skills of such categories of learners through various extension programs. As a part of this endeavour, the Regional Centre organized a computer awareness workshop for mentally challenged children at Asha Niketan, Nandi on 03/07/2019. As we are all aware the attention span of children with mental challenges is quite limited and to train them in computer skills is a major challenge. During the workshop an effort was made assess the attention span of such children while engaging with digital hardware. It was found that there is substantial difference between the attention span of various categories of mentally challenged learners such as autistic students, students with cerebral palsy and those with mental retardation. The aim of such mapping is to ensure that we are able to develop customized study modules to impart basic computer literacy in different categories of mentally challenged children. The Regional Centre will be seeking the assistance of experts working in the field to develop digital games for such learners. The sessions at Asha Niketan were taken up by Mr.Jithesh Roshan. A and Ms.Archana. A. The workshop was also attended by Dr.M.Rajesh, RD, Dr.Prameela.O, ARD and Mr.B.Praveen Kumara, AR along with other functionaries from Asha Niketan. It is hoped that through a series of interaction, Regional Centre Vatakara will be able to provide customized digital learning solutions to these disadvantaged sections of the society.
